The Scottish Executive action plan aimed at helping 66,000 Scots off benefits and into work over the next four years was published in June. Workforce Plus: An Employability Framework for Scotland sets out how organisations can better work together at a national and local level to improve support for those facing barriers to employment, including people with disabilities and lone parents.

Actions will include:

- Locally agreed targets for reducing the number of people dependent on work-related benefits in seven priority areas with the highest number of workless people.

- Additional funding of £11 million between now and 2007-08 for target employability areas to implement local action plans. Increased engagement with businesses through advisory groups, trade unions and others to build the role employers play, both public and private.

This event will look at the policies behind the document, explore current practice across Scotland, and suggest how what is working well can be replicated and mainstreamed.
